AMHT Develops a Comprehensive Protection Policy Workshop for Local Organizations

In an effort to refine the existing policies toward protecting vulnerable clients, Arusha Mental Health Staff participated in a policy development workshop in August which refined a comprehensive protection policy to be reviewed and set forward for adoption at the AMHT Annual General Meeting in November of this year.

Developing protection policies is an important part of the work AMHT does in mental health. Policy development workshops are being offered to other organizations as requested in an effort to educate staff on issues of abuse and protecting all of the people in the organization, staff and clients alike.

The policy is based on Tanzanian law (Law of the Child Act, 2009) and International standards of child protection (UNICEF, 1996). As foundational documents, these call organizations to put into place policies and behavioral guidelines which will protect vulnerable people.

The policy development workshops offered by AMHT are interactive and participatory. The process with develop an organization specific policy, and at the same time educate and train staff on issues of abuse and prevention of

abuse. Staff are required to develop behavioral protocols which pertain to the organization's specific activities, and communication and reporting procedures which are practical, based in legal and ethical principles, and which are culturally appropriate.
